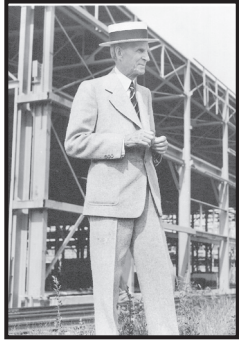

He aimed at the economic independence of the United States. Mr. Ford wanted to control all of the phases involved in manufacturing a vehicle and this led him to create

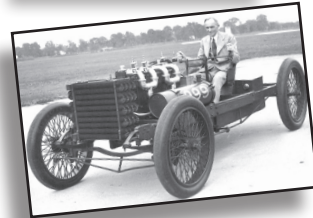
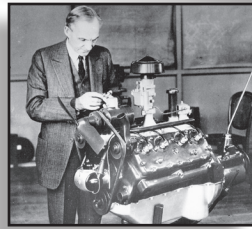
one of the most vertically integrated business enterprises the world has ever seen. He believed in peace. He fostered the concepts of global expansion of the company and international trade. Ford's work represented the distinctive American nature and culture.

Mr. Ford also made major contributions to industries other than automotive. For instance the Ford Trimotor Airplane was the world's most popular passenger plane with over 100 airlines owning the plane by the early 1930's. Additionally, the Ford Airport in Dearborn was the first to have a navigational beacon for adverse weather operations and concrete runways. He also pioneered the use of soybeans for industrial uses including in paints and car parts such as dash knobs.

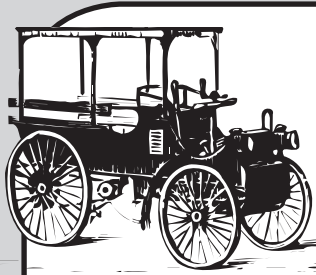

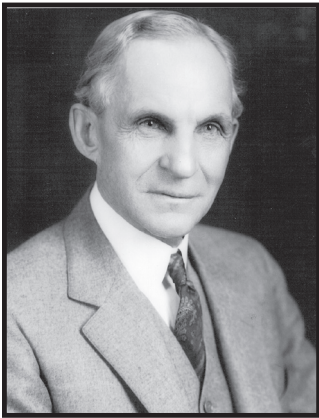
